ENVA Bird hazard in AIP Norway:

- Concentrations of seagulls may occur on and in the vicinity of AD.
- Swans are present in the vicinity of AD, particularly during winter.
- Flocks of geese pass AD northbound during spring migration MAR-APR.
- During autumn migration geese are present on and in the vicinity of AD from AUG to NOV. At night they reside on the sea and former riverbed N of AD. They fly to and from the farmlands S and E of AD.
- Occasionally eagles fly over and in the vicinity of AD.

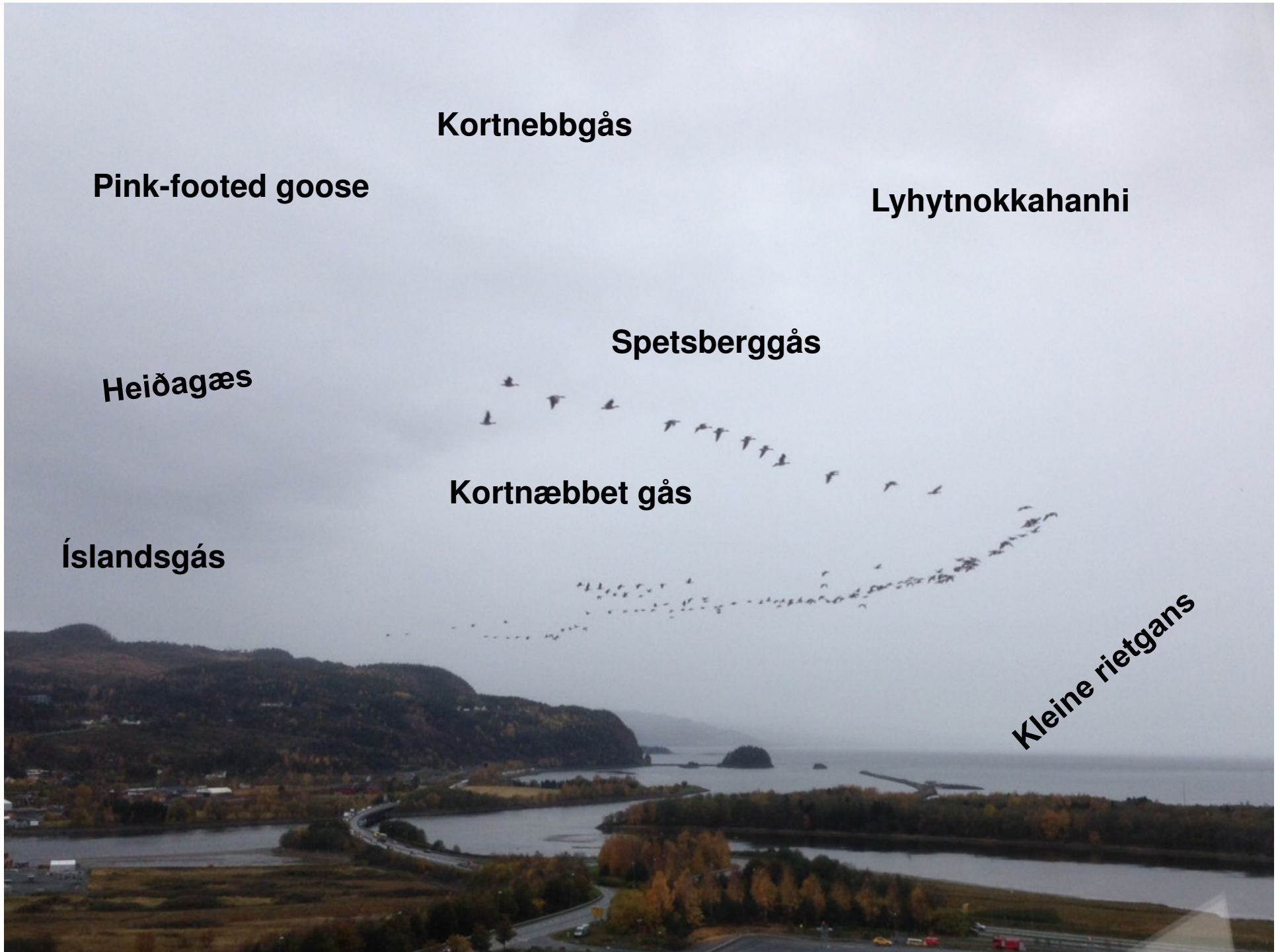

Bird strike 2 Jan 2014

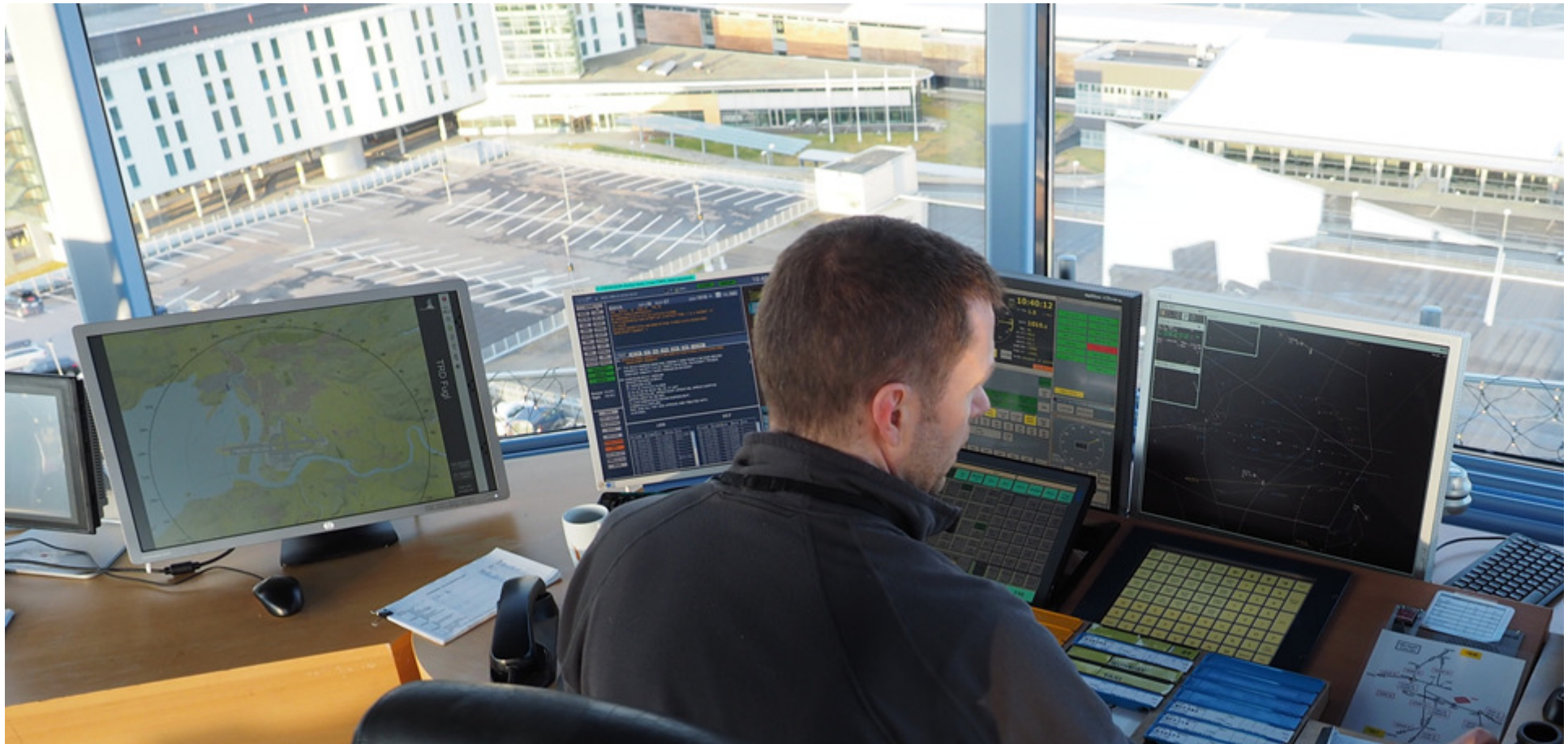


Remains 6,7 kg

- Bird radar on test from April 2014
- Already in June 2014 it was recommended to put a monitor in TWR
- Monitor in the tower from Sept 2014
- Good effect during geese migration autumn 2014 and spring 2015
- Bird radar repositioned to top of hotel June 2015
- Challenges with new position

AIP Norway:

Bird scare patrols use various equipment, including flare shell crackers, handheld lasers and shooting. Four remote-controlled gas exploders are located on AD during the summer season.
